

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS
Farmington Hills firefighters made 87 runs for the week of Oct. 23-29 including 47 (54 percent) medical runs, nine (10 percent) rescue runs and four fires.

FIRE
Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 put out a fire in a 1994 Chevy 3500 flat-bed wrecker on Grand River at 11:04 a.m. Oct. 28. The fire was confined to the passenger area but caused \$25,000 in damage to the truck and \$2,300 in damage to contents. It was the second time the same truck had caught fire, the driver said.

BREAK-INS


