Farmington Civic Band founders celebrate 30-year anniversary

In 1965, Paul and Fern Barber had a dream of forming a quality community musical group that would not only entertain audiences but also provide an outlet for many talented musicians in this area.

Founded as the Farmington

Civic Band, the vision has developed from an initial six member group to encompass today's sixty-five member concert band, a 20 piece jazz/dance band, clarinet choir, Dixieland band, and other small ensembles.

The band is a non-profit organization sponsored by individual, business and corporate patronage, as well as grants from the Farmington Area Arts Commission.

The band is guided and operated by a 30-member board of directors representing all facets of the community. The band conducts

business at regular quarterly meetings and assigns the daily operation to the executive board and professional staff consisting of the conductor, business manager, librarian, and equipment manager.

The band's founder and conductor R. Paul Barber and his wife Fern, who is the principal clarinetist and concert mistress, have seen their dream of 30 years ago realized.

"We never envisioned at the time that 30 years later our group would encompass the kind of talent we have as a volunteer type of organization," R. Paul Barber said. "Eleven of our band members have been involved with the band for over 20 years and our band members represent 19 different communities in addition to Farmington."
