strengthen the ties of our community's heritage, list as many of the arts that might need to be included:

- provide a networking system within our community and coordinate the networking efforts with interests outside the community to strengthen our cultural offerings;
- develop a central clearing house to coordinate the scheduling, promoting and publicity of cultural events;
- get the business, corporate, residential and professional community involved in the community's cultural efforts, thus ensuring success of the cultural group's mission;
- create an awareness and appreciation

of the cultural ambience of Farmington and Farmington Hills; and

- foster support in the community for a cultural activities building to accommodate cultural interests.

I am honored to have been asked to serve as the chairman of the Farmington Community Arts Council and serve as chairman of the Farmington Area Arts Commission as well. Serving with me is vice chairman Jamie Mason, director of extension and community services of Oakland Community College, and secretary/treasurer Kathy Hall, manager of the Farmington Community Chorus. The Farmington Community Arts Council meets monthly on

the second Thursday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Heritage Park Visitors Center. A \$25 membership fee has been initiated to help the Arts Council meet its goals. All organizations focusing on arts and culture, and seeking involvement with the arts council, are welcome.

Ideas for collaborative exhibits and presentations are pouring forth. Informative meeting programs are being selected. The Arts Council is preparing a quarterly arts and cultural events brochure for the Farmington community.

With diverse tools and talents, the arts and cultural organizations of Farmington and Farmington Hills have long offered us an

opportunity for involvement, enrichment and expression. How fortunate we are to have them join together to coordinate efforts for the benefit of this fine community.

I think it's important to note the Farmington Area Arts Commission is a separate and distinct entity from the Farmington Community Arts Council. The commission is city appointed to support organizations of the arts council.
