# Church founder is in Hall of Fame

Mary Baker Eddy, founder and leader of Christian Science, was among 18 distinguished American women inducted into the Nation-al Women's Hall of Fame recent-

Eddy was selected as the only American woman to found a last-ing American-based denomina-

Easy was selected as the only American woman to found a lasting American-based denomination.

The ceremony took place in Sence Falls, N.Y., the birthplace of women's rights. Among theyer's inductees were Sendra Day O'Conner, Ella Pitzgerald and Elizabeth Dole.

The 1995 National Honors Ceremonies were hosted by Judy Woodruff, prime anchor of CNN. Virgina S. Harris, chairman of The Christian Science Board of Directors and publisher of the Writings of Mary Baker Eddy, accepted the Hall of Pame medallion on Eddy's behalf.

In concluding her remarks, Harris said: "it is my privilege to accept this honor of Mary Baker Eddy's life and achievements. And, I do so on behalf of all those bleased, as I have been, by the good she has done —— and for those who, in years to come, will be blessed by her profound love for all mankind."

Eddy's election to the Hall of Fame took place approximately 120 years after the publication of Her major work, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," and the founding of the Church of Christ, Scientiat, in Boston, Mass.

Since the book was first published in 1876. "Science and Health" has been a consistent best-seller, with the sales to date topping the 9 million mark.


Eddy's rise from obscurity in rural New Hampshire to prominence as the founder of a worldwide religion was a remarkable



achievement for a woman — all the more remarkable because it took place in the male-dominated society of the 10th century. Following what Eddy understood to be God's direction, she was led to discover a practical, spiritual means of healing, and set it forth in "Science and Health," the textbook of Christian Science.
