coordinate the program for Novi, Northville, Farmington, Farmington, Hills, Wallet Lake, Vittom, New Hudson, South Lyon, White Lake, and a portion of Livoria, Canton and Plymouth.

"It just blossoms a little bit every year," said Yarbrough, "It gets a little bit bigger and a little bit more organized and a little bit more organized and a little bit better every year."

Last year, in addition to all the toys collected, they received

\$5,000 in cash donations. Yarbrough and her volunteers turned that into \$10,000 worth of toys. "We filled the upstairs of the American Legion Itall in Northville," she said.

As Yarbrough a 3-year-old son climbed onto her lap, she confessed, "After my husband and I had Joseph, for me there was always a commitment there. I used to invite myself to poker pattles just to collect money and go buy toys. My husband, Jim, can't imagine a child going without Christmas.

Many volunteers are needed just to recreening applicants, sorting, collecting, transporting and distributing toys. Calvin Wimberly, an

officer with the Royal Oak Township Police Department confessed a need for people to help sort through the toys, "It's not an easy job," he said.

"They fill up at least two vans worth of toys every year," he said. "All their friends know about this party and every year they come in droves and they're bringing toys under both arms."

phones, publicity and thousands of helping hands.
