Five salsas are available from a mild, fruity pincapple, crunchy eucumber, a surprisingly mild, yet flavordu green chile, tasty fresca and red hot. "Some people like it better," Shaver said, Regulars know to ask for Stove hot sauce. A batch, at the ready in the kitchen, can be substituted, added to fresca for extra rip or mixed with the bean dish sides for the same purpose.
