

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-16-95, an Ordinance to Amend Chapter 34, Zoning, Article V, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmington Hills, Michigan. Belating to Accessory Uses and Home Occupations in Multiple-Pamily and One-Family Districts.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.

Chapter 34, Zoning, Article V, (RC-1, RC-2 and RC-3 Multiple-Family Residential Districts), is hereby amended to add Section 34-116, to read as follows:

Sec. 34-116. Accessory uses permitted subject to special co

- (1) Home occupations, including uses involving the use of business mailing addresses and business telephone numbers in dwelling units, shall be permitted subject to the following conditions.
 - All home occupations shall be conducted so as not to be noticeable from the exterior of the dwelling.
 - No signs accessory to the home occupation shall be permitted.
 - Traffic and delivery of goods created by the home occupation shall not exceed that normally created by residential uses.
 - The home occupation shall not service more then one (1) client or customer at a time on the premises.
 - No employees, other than residents of the dwelling unit, shall be employed at or be otherwise located on the premises, and no whickes owned or operated by employees other than said residents shall be parked on or near the premises.
 - residents shall be parted on or near the premises.

 The total floor area of all buildings used for the home occupation, including atorage of materials, supplies, etc., chall not exceed fifteen 105 percent of the floor area of the individual dwelling unit.

 Nuisance factors are prohibited.
