■ **MOTT 85, FARMINGTON 32:** Waterford Mott made sure the visiting Falcons didn't have a successful start in their 1995-96 season opener Tuesday.

The Corsairs took control of the game early, building on a 17-9 lead in the first quarter. Mott led 36-21 by halftime and dominated the second half, outscoring the Falcons 49-11.

Junior guard Nick Sertic led Farmington with 10 points, and senior postman Jim Murphy added 11 for the Falcons.

Guard Alex Zuzunovskis' 23 points paced Mott. Mike Glynn chipped in 14.

■ **KETTERING 76, HARRISON 58:** Farmington Hills Harrison's fourth-quarter rally fell short Tuesday at Waterford Kettering.

The Hawks trailed by only eight points but threw the ball

away on two straight trips down the floor, opening the door for the Captains to pull away.

"They hit some three pointers and snuck in there for some offensive rebounds and some slashes," Harrison coach Mike Teachman said. "They're very quick and got into shooting position before we were ready."

After taking a 15-13 lead after one quarter, the Captains built a 13-point halftime lead by outscoring the Hawks 27-16 in the second quarter.

Kettering nailed seven of its 15 attempts from three-point range. Seniors Mike Postle and Jo Davidson netted 16 points apiece for the Captains. Chris Donk and Matt Pike tallied 13 and 10 points, respectively.

Sophomore Matt Derocher paced Harrison with 15 points. Junior Justin Snow added 13, sophomore Lewis Lewis and junior Kevin Hambenek seven each.

Both teams made nine of 16 free throws. The Hawks sank only 23 of their 73 field-goal attempts.

■ **REDFORD CC 77, YPSILANTI 60:** Senior guard Justin Hare, out most of last season with a broken leg, scored 20 points and grabbed eight rebounds Tuesday to lead Catholic Central.

Michael Jordan, a senior forward, had 18 points and nine rebounds, while jun-

ior guard Mark McDonald contributed 18 points.

Senior guard Chris Misak dished out five assists for host CC.

Ypsilanti was led by point guard Stephan Allen, who tallied a game-high 24 points. Howard Allen added 12, all on three-pointers.

CC led 29-23 at halftime, but Ypsilanti closed the gap by scoring on eight of its first 10 possessions, including four tries to open the third.

■ **CLARENCEVILLE 62, 5 FIELD 45:** Deadly free throw shooting enabled Livonia Clarenceville to earn a season-opening victory Tuesday at Southfield Christian.

The Trojans made 70 percent from the line (19 of 24), including 12 straight in the final quarter.

Senior forward Scott Barnard led the winners with 18 points, six rebounds and five assists.

Senior guard Joe Hernandez added 16 points and five assists. He was 13-of-14 from the foul stripe, including 10-of-10 in the final period as Clarenceville outscored the Eagles 23-11.

Jason Merritt, a junior forward, contributed 13 points and eight rebounds. Senior forward Jack Stallings was a defensive standout with six steals.

Chris Steffe scored a team-high 17 points for Southfield Christian, which committed 30 turnovers under Clarenceville's full-court pressure.

■ **CHURCHILL 72, DEARBORN 70:** Livonia Churchill hadn't won a season basketball opener for awhile, and for that matter, beaten Dearborn in years.

But the Chargers opened their 1995-96 season with a homecourt victory over the Pioneers as junior forward Shawn Woloszyn tallied a game-high 22 points. Churchill held on for the victory despite making only 13 of 27 free throws in the decisive fourth quarter.

The Chargers were 20-of-40 on the night, but Dwight Andrews helped seal the victory with a pair of free throws with 21 seconds remaining.

Dearborn answered with a three-pointer, cutting the deficit to 71-70, but senior forward Allen Polanski, who added 20 points, hit the front-end of a one-and-one to give Churchill the final margin of victory.

The Pioneers, Mega Conference White Division champs a year ago, missed a desperation shot at the buzzer. Matt Hughes, a senior guard, chipped in 15 points for Churchill, while 6-7 senior center Jay Van Wagner added seven points and 10 rebounds.

Kevin Kreyer and Ryan Wilkinson each scored 17 points for the Pioneers.

"They surprised us with the press early and we threw the ball away," said Churchill coach Tom Lang, whose team trailed 17-7 after one quarter. "But we handled it much better from then on and we didn't have much trouble."

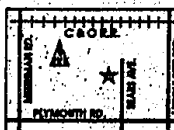
