Does the thought of sitting through one more production of "A Christmas Carol" make you want to say, "Bah humbug?" Dicken's himself, played with enormous charm and aplomb by Richard Schot, is an ever-present on-stage narrator who adds a lot of the comedy. Since Dickens was an ameteur magician, he also performs lots of magic tricks that nicely underscore the theatrical magic of the main story.

Asking audience members for a show of hands if they already know the plot, Schrot plays on this familiarity, encouraging the spectators to interact with the spectators to interact with the cast at some spots.

For example, when Scrooge (Phillip Locker) is unable to see the Spirit of Christmas Past lurking in the shadows, Schrot becomes a cheerleader urging the audience to scream "Behind you!" Behind you!" Behind you!"

Locker is a perfect Scroogcqually believable as the gruff old
miser and the transformed caring

that the changes never jar.

Thomas D. Mahard is excellent
as Bob Cratchit, whose cold
hands as he works in Scrooge's
unheated office are in perfect contrast to the warmth of his heart
and hearth. He is well-paired with
Mary Benson as his loving wife.
Benson also shines as the lively
Mrs. Fezzwig, reveiling in Christmas with John Patrick Lowrie as
her jolly husband.

All of the many youngsters in
the east perform with remarkable
polish. The lad playing Tiny Tim
limped across the stage most convincingly with a brace and crutch.

However, there are two young ac-tors assigned to each child's role, and the program gives no help.

The entire supporting cast of Londoners, both young and old, are delightfully animated throughout. Diane Von Foasen is especially amusing as the staid old maid Carolyn, courted ineptly by the drunken Topper (Richard Madlatt).

Peter Hicks's revolving set and Barbara Jenks's Victorian costumes are top-notch. Sherman's very fine direction brings all the humor and pathos together with admirable skill so that any modern-day Scrooge leaves the theater feeling merry and uplified in spite of his natural inclinations.
