or maybe, it's because the Shamrocks only lost two wrestlers from their 21-3 dual-meet squad

Whatever the case, the CC wresting team enters this season bursting with confidence and hopes of winning its first Class A state championship since 1988.

"The team belleves they are going to go all the way," said coach Mike Rodriguez, who atumbled through last season after getting both knees replaced. "This team isn't quite as good as the 1988 team, which was an awesome team, but this is the best group I've had since."

A healthier Rodrguez shares his team's confidence and hopes his grapplers will earn him his eighth state title in 28 years at CC.

"I think we'll surprise a lot of people by the end of the year," he

said. "We have six seniors this year and they are very dedicated. Plus, whenever you win a state football champlonship, it can't hurt by giving the rest of the school added confidence."

The Shamrocks have a good and Shamocas have a good mixture of veterans and under-classmen on the squad. Rodriguez was fortunate that he only had to fill the voids of graduated soniors Bill Lamb (112) and the late Dan Krueger (160).

The leading returned it senior John Spolsky, the All-Observer-land fullback who led the Shamrocks to the state title in football less than a month ago.

Spolsky lost in the champion-ship match at the state finals last year but has returned with one goal.

"He's determined to win the title," Rodriguez said. "He's a lot stronger than he was last year and he's a bonafide heavyweight. He gained about 40 pounds. We

Leading the sophomore class will be Aaron Rock at 160. He ad-vanced to the regionals as a fresh-man and has improved.

"You'll be hearing a lot about this guy this season and in the fu-ture." Rodriguez said.

Sophomore Joe Stroi (189) is almost totally healed from the broken collarbone suffered at last season's Catholic League championships. Sophomores Matt Petersen (125) and Matt Burns (130) are the newcomers on the CC variational of the collaboration of the collab sity squad.

At 140, sophomore Rob Went-worth appears to have the posi-tion locked up, but has yet to make the weight. Freshman Ryan Zajdel filled in when the Sham-rocks opened their season Thurs-day by trouncing Davison 63-16.

There may not be many lightweights on the CC schedule this season as Rodriguez has scheduled some of the state's perennial powers.

"There's no question that play-ing the best will help us improve for the end of the season," Rodri-guez said. "It will especially help our younger wrestlers. We have time to grow and get even tough-er."
