CC tight end decides on Falcons

Redford Catholic Central senior tight end Eric Gilbo had a couple reasons to feel good inside about his recent visit to Bowling Green State University:

There were the players and students on campus, who made him feel comfortable, not uneasy. And how about the Falcons' new state-of-the-art indoor practice facility, which is as nice inside as any facility like it in the country.

Gilbo compares it to the one he practiced in with his CC teammates at the University of Michigan prior to last month's Class AA state championship game.

"It's the same," said Gilbo, a Canton resident.

Gilbo, a first-team All Observer choice, committed Sunday night to BGUSU after returning from his second official visit to Ball State University. Along with liking the facilities, a winning tradition and the 80-minute ride down I-75 to the campus just south of Toledo, Gilbo said the Falcons are giving him the opportunity to play tight end.

Because of Gilbo's 6-foot-7, 260-pound frame, some schools were thinking only of playing him at tackle.

The Falcons' head coach is Gary Blackney, a former assistant coach at Wisconsin, UCLA, Syracuse and Ohio State. He has a 41-14-2 record in five years at BGUSU, leading the Falcons to Mid-American Conference championships in 1991 and '92 and a second place finish in '94.

The Falcons slumped to a 5-6

overall record last fall despite a road victory over Big Eight opponent Missouri.

Gilbo, who will be eligible as a freshman after getting a 21 on his ACT test, selected the Falcons over Ball State and Toledo.

"I fit in better with their team. It seemed like a better atmosphere for me. The campus is real nice, clean," Gilbo said. "I want to be involved in the offense, catching balls, rather than just blocking. Coach Blackney seemed real up front, he's going to tell you what he thinks. They show to their tight end I think 50 times."

"He said, 'That's great,'" Gilbo said. "He told me to work on

Spolsky. I said, 'All right, no problem.'"

Spolsky visited the Air Force Academy last weekend and said Monday night he's still undecided. He hopes to make up his mind by Christmas.

Spolsky has a 3.23 grade point average and got a 25 on his ACT test.

Shamrocks make state title their goal

Perhaps it's the fact Redford Catholic Central is coming off another state football championship.

Or maybe, it's because the Shamrocks only lost two wrestlers from their 21-3 dual-meet squad of last season.

Whatever the case, the CC wrestling team enters this season bursting with confidence and hopes of winning its first Class A state championship since 1988.

"The team believes they are going to go all the way," said coach Mike Rodriguez, who stumbled through last season after getting both knees replaced. "This team isn't quite as good as the 1988 team, which was an awesome team, but this is the best group I've had since."

A healthier Rodriguez shares his team's confidence and hopes his grapplers will earn him his eighth state title in 28 years at CC.

"I think we'll surprise a lot of people by the end of the year," he

said. "We have six seniors this year and they are very dedicated. Plus, whenever you win a state football championship, it can't hurt by giving the rest of the school added confidence."

The Shamrocks have a good mixture of veterans and underclassmen on the squad. Rodriguez was fortunate that he only had to fill the voids of graduated seniors Bill Lamb (112) and the late Dan Krueger (160).

The leading returnee is senior John Spolsky, the All-Observerland fullback who led the Shamrocks to the state title in football less than a month ago.

Spolsky lost in the championship match at the state finals last year but has returned with one goal.

"He's determined to win the title," Rodriguez said. "He's a lot stronger than he was last year and he's a bonafide heavyweight. He gained about 40 pounds. We

think he's the favorite for the title and has the inside line."

Three more state qualifiers in seniors Kevin Griffin (145), Dave Gardner (155) and Dario Ianni (112) return.

Junior Dave O'Hara, who finished seventh in the state at 103 as a sophomore, is a "slicker" wrestler according to Rodriguez. Senior Dave Garcia (152) is also improved after advancing to the Greco Roman finals at this past summer's Junior World Championships.

A surprise by the end of the season may be senior Lucian Harbar (171), who Rodriguez predicts will place at the state finals.

Junior Jeff Bracken (217) was last season's surprise after placing in the Catholic League championships. Junior Mike Zelenock (119) also had a solid sophomore season, advancing to the regionals.

Leading the sophomore class will be Aaron Rock at 160. He advanced to the regionals as a freshman and has improved.

"You'll be hearing a lot about this guy this season in the future," Rodriguez said.

Sophomore Joe Strol (189) is almost totally healed from a broken collarbone suffered at last season's Catholic League championships. Sophomores Matt Peterson (125) and Matt Burns (130) are the newcomers on the CC varsity squad.

At 140, sophomore Rob Wentworth appears to have the position locked up, but has yet to make the weight. Freshman Ryan Zajdel filled in when the Shamrocks opened their season Thursday by trouncing Davison 63-18.

There may not be many lightweights on the CC schedule this season as Rodriguez has scheduled some of the state's perennial powers.

"There's no question that playing the best will help us improve for the end of the season," Rodriguez said. "It will especially help our younger wrestlers. We have time to grow and get even tougher."
