I would count myself lucky to own his coffee urn, sugar bowl and creamer. Charles Rennie Mach-tosh created a fascinating massive ster-ling candlestick in the early 1900s. It is as modern as if designed yesterday.

Knowing wood

In pursuit of wood, investigate pieces called "Treen." Shaped and turned out of one solid piece of tree root it is exquisitely grained. These items are rarely large. Also seek out wooden tea caddy boxes that oft times were trimmed with ivory. They are generally 18th or 19th century, but there are good reproduc-tions. Remember the Boston Tea Party? Tea was a precious commodity and respectfully treated with tender loving

care.
Wooden snuff boxes were also very important to our predecessors, and should be researched to comprise a collection. Wooden barley twisted candlesticks with wonderful brass bobeche cups make captivating additions.

Another incredible antique accessory box is fashioned of tortoise shell. The

very special onces are trimmed with sliver and/or ivery. They are usually beige and brown in coloration, but some have been dyed red. Antique show dealers inevitably have several on display. Beware of the dyed ones; they may not be genuine.

If you have never seen a "porcupine box, inquire regarding same. Their quills are lined up side by side, the ends imbedded in black edging. The boxes come in many sizes and shapes, usually with a lift-top cover. They are especially decorative and make for good

conversation.

Ideas for edible "decorations" that you can make and place on the tree include stringing popcorn, fresh cramberries, thick fresh orange slices, peanuts in the shell, dried apples or dried figs on heavy string, packing pinecones with suet and birdseed; and/or hanging fresh crabapples by the stem, rice cakes, baby cranappies by the stem, rice cakes, any dried corn bundles, dried cars of color-ful corn with husks or red seedless grapes tied up in bunches. In addition, peanuts in the shell and whole walnuts

peanuts in the shell and whole walnuts can be scattered under the tree.
Natural rough brown string, ribbon and raffic can be used for hanging and decorations. Also consider decorating with lengths of natural wool or string. The birds will use this material for nesting in the spring.
