Hills police probe accidental shooting

Farmington Hills police are investigating an accidental shooting at Kinko's on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills Jan. 2.

A Hills resident, 52, was making copies when his beeper went off, police said. He then went to a phone to make a call when a two-shot Derringer pistol fell from his waistband inside his left pant leg at 6:30 p.m. The gun discharged when it hit the floor, grazing the rear of the man's leg but injuring no one else.

The man, who told police he had a concealed weapons permit, was taken to Botsford General Hospital where he was

treated and released.

The man told police he was a reserve officer with Royal Oak Township and had retired from another department out of state.

"We are trying to verify that," said Detective Sgt. Tim Swanson, adding that the man is not presently a reserve officer with the township.

Police are trying to determine if the man has a valid concealed weapon permit for the 38-caliber gun, which police described as being in "poor" condition.

A Commerce Township woman and her two young children were in the shop at the time and witnessed the accident, but weren't hurt.
