

## POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## ■ FIRES

Farmington Hills firefighters from Stations 2 and 4 responded to an apartment fire at the Citation Club Apartments on Fountain at 7:14 p.m. Dec. 2. The fire had been put out. Firefighters set up a fan to remove the smoke. Damage was confined to the kitchen. The fire, caused by cooking grease, caused \$5,000 in damage to contents and \$5,000 in damage to the property.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Stations 1 and 3 put out a chimney fire at a residence on River Glen in Farmington Hills at 4:31 p.m. Jan. 2. The creosote had caught fire, but there was no other damage.

## ■ BREAK-INS

The side window was pried open on a construction trailer at Nine Mile and Tuck in Farmington Hills causing \$200 in damage and a telephone, fax machine, answering machine and cordless drills were stolen between Dec. 30 and Jan. 2.

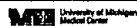
