Oakland Community College's Smith Theatre on the Orchard Ridge Campus, Orchard Lake Road and I-696.

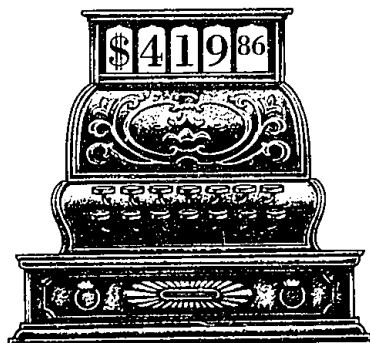
Audition times are 1-1:30 p.m. for ages 7 and 8; 1:30-3 p.m. for
