Telecommunication Bill that recently went through the House
and Senate and Is now in joint
committee. Since President Clintion specifically endorsed such circuitry at a conference on Family
Values in July, the V-chip is likely to be part of the final bill.

Who decides on the ratings?

Well the bill says the TV and video programming industry will

have to come up with a "voluntary" way to assign ratings. It gives the industry one year from the date of enectment of the legislation to do this.

If the industry doesn't accomplish this, then the law requires the FCC to create an advisory committee of parents, programmers, broadcasters and cable operators to do the ratings.

There is an underlying fear here of violation of the First Amendment. The V-chip la a Censor-Chip," says Tony Podesta of the First Amendment Rights Working Group. It restricts the ability of the parents to choose what they want to block from their children. It can only block whatever the

government ratings board doems objectionsbia. If parents want to regulate what their kids are watching, they ought to be able to buy products in their local electronics ators which they can control — not be mandated to buy something which the government controls," he asserts.

If the government labels programs objectionable, advertisers will shy away from supporting these shows. Broadcasters are totally dependent upon advertising revenues while pay cable companies are not, popular programing almost at sulti views may be driven from broadcast to pay cable.

Dick Rolfe, president of the

Deve Foundation, a non-profit organization in Grand Rapida, whose mission is to encourage and promote the creation of wholesome family entertainment feels, "even if programming does migrate to cable, parents choose to subscribe to a cable service, unlike broadcast signals that come into homes and are accessible to children whether they like tor not. Consequently, Network TV should be held to a higher standard than cable."
