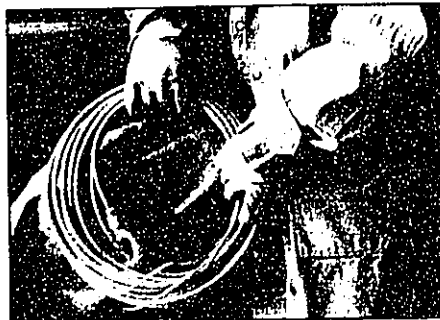
FROM HARVEST GOLD TO WHITE

Homeowners who wish to change the color of old kitchen appliances may find that having them electrostatically painted by a professional is decidedly less expensive than purchasing new ones. Electrostatic painting is a special technique for painting metal and porcelain appliances. Among its chief advantages is the fact that overcoating is so minimal that appliances can be painted in place. Once the appliance to be painted is wiped down and left unpainted for 24 hours, it will be grounded by attaching a wire that leads from its base to a water pipe or electrical box. Surrounding produces a negative electrical current in the appliance's metal coating. Next, the appliance is sprayed with a positive charged paint by an electrostatic gun, resulting in paint that bonds to metal with a beautiful finish.

Electrostatic painting provides an inexpensive alternative to purchasing new appliances.
