# Falcons coast to win over Raiders

## WRESTLING

The advantage was heavily weighted in Farmington's favor, and the Falcons used it to dominate North Farmington in wrestling Thursday.

Farmington won five of the seven matches that were contested and benefited from seven voids to defeat the visiting Raiders 69-9.

North had just seven varsity wrestlers on its bench and needed to win all seven bouts by pin to break even and earn a tie.

But the outcome was no longer in doubt and the match decided after the 112-pound contest in which Farmington's Matt Michalski pinned (2:53) Scott Richmond for a 12-0 lead.

"We have to do something to turn this program around,"

North coach Zaim Cunnulaj said. "We have to get more bodies out; the kids we have are young."

"One of the two juniors won, and our senior (Steve Accor) won. The rest are sophomores and freshmen."

The Falcons, who rebounded from a loss to Walpole Central in their previous dual, are 1-1 in the Lakes Division and 5-3 overall.

"Our attitude has improved in the weight room," Farmington coach Al Beyar said. "We've got some experienced kids in the lineup, but we're a real young team in the middle."

"It's hard to balance both

ends of the spectrum. The veteran kids know what they have to do, and the young ones have to learn it."

Dave LaBerge, who failed to make weight at 112 and went to 110, had the first of two North victories, a 10-5 decision over Brian Macies.

Farmington sandwiched pins around a walkover win by Mike Lane (1:30), Martin Spinks (1:25) pinned Fritz Schullies in 1:27, and Charlie (1:35) Jaeger pinned Evan Kaplos in 1:35.

Cory Perry (1:40) defeated Joe Djonovic 6-0 to give the Falcons a 33-3 lead.

The Raiders voided the next four weights to Farmington's Nick Colson (1:40), Adny Wood (1:52), Dean Gozowsky (1:60) and Ryan Terwilliger (1:71). Seven Sahliner also won by forfeit at

103, and heavyweight Adam Tanelian won a walkover.

Farmington's Jake Lawrence (1:69) pinned Kevin Bayer in 36 seconds to make the score 63-3, and Steve Acton (2:16) earned North's only other win with a pin over Brian White in 3:05.

Michalski improved his unbeaten record to 17-0. Jaeger (junior) is 11-6, Martin Spinks (sophomore) 11-5, Tanelian (senior) 13-5, Terwilliger (senior) 13-6, Sahliner (sophomore) 10-6 and Mike Lane (senior) 5-2.

"That's pretty much the strength of our lineup there," Beyar said. "The second semester starts Monday, and we might pick up a couple wrestlers who were ineligible. If we do, they'll help our lineup."
