## Flanders students work up an appetite

George Washington Carver's
life was food for thought on Marie

estables. Crutcher wondered why.

Such resourcefulness was inspired at an early age, Crutcher said. Carver graduated from high school and was the first black person to graduate from lows State.
He was also an accomplished artist, drawing and painting, Crutcher said. Many of his paintings were lost in a fire but a few exist in the Tunkegee Institute. "In those days, he didn't have a lot of money which you need in
