

Police

Hills man dies in crash

A Farmington Hills man died from injuries from a traffic accident on Grand River near Brittain Hill in Farmington Hills Tuesday morning. Michael Thomas Ureel, 29, died at about 3 p.m. at Botsford General Hospital from injuries. Ureel was making a left turn onto Grand River at 11:13 a.m. when it was struck in the driver's door area by a west-bound 1993 Olds Cutlass driven by Constance Eugenia Nowicki, 38, of Wixom.

Nowicki suffered minor injuries and was taken to Providence Hospital in Novi where she was treated and released.

Farmington Hills police are asking anyone who witnessed the accident to call 473-0683 with any information. The accident remains under investigation and no citation has been issued.

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
