Information superhighway yields dangers for children

The Internet offers an exhila-rating and educational ride on the information highway. But any where there is traffic, albeit elec-tronic data bytes, there must also be caution.

The Internet la no different,

Recent reports about "cyber-space predators" — including the Farmington Hills man charged re-cently with molestating an 11-year-old boy — has police, teach-ers and parents worried.

ers and parents worned.

The Internet links computers around the world, providing a wealth of information and research material. Are the Internet's educational capabilities outweighed by risks posed by going on-line?

going on-line?

Not if children are supervised, said one Farmington teacher.

"You wank kids to be exposed to new technology," said Hillside Elementary teacher Jean Warner, "but there are limitations. I wouldn't let my child wander out in the street." in the street."
Through the Internet, students

Commercial on line services — such as Prodigy, Compuserve and American On-line — provide parental controls for Internet use.

Software is only part of the solution, said a Michigan State Police computer expert. Parenta
need to monitor what they're children are accessing on the 'Net.
"The disadvantage is parents
who don't know much about computers or don't seen like computers," said Michigan State Folices
Sg. Robert Peplinsk. "When
they see their child working on ecomputer, they think have nothing to worry about."
