
To minimize problems with contrast, photograph subjects that are out of direct sunlight. Better still, an overcast day provides the best lighting for street-life people pictures. Bright colors are more saturated and lighting on faces is more flattering.

Use a fast film in the 400ASA range other color or black and white depend-ing on your preference. The faster films will enable you to handhold exposures under most circumstances.

So there you have it! Become streetwise with streetlife.
