

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BRIEFINGS

The driver's window was broken and the wires were cut, causing \$1,000 in damage to a white 1993 Chevy Lumina parked at the Village Oaks Apartments on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills Jan. 15-16, and a \$100 AM/FM stereo and \$250 in medical school books were stolen.

The passenger door lock was punched (\$300) on a white 1993 Chevy Cavalier parked at the Cedarbrook Apartments on Middlebelt in Farmington Hills Jan. 15-16 and a \$100 AM/FM cassette stereo was stolen.
