## Restoring campus facilities tops OCC meeting

Battered parking lots, broken
sldewalks and leaky roofs will get
priority attention at Oakland
Community College.

OCC's construction manager,
George W. Auch Co. of Pontiac,
will begin proposing packages of
projects for bid as early as the
board's Feb. 10 meeting.

"We can get on a fast track with
some of the bidding." Interim
Chancellor Anthony Jarson said
at the Jan. 22 meeting.

The board made restoring campus facilities its top priority last
June 12 when voters approved 32
million in new property taxes, a
nearly one-third increase in the
budget.

"Take 'hefore' and 'after' pictures, and have them duted," suggested vice chair Judith Wiser of

OCC has five campuses, a district office in Bloomfield Hills and a Pontiac Center. "We can put together packages of projects." said Auch engineer Steve Baldwin, citing lighting and parking lots as needs common to several locations.

Tom Hickey, a vice president of the Auch company, said team members have studied aerial photos; taken day-long tours of every facility from Jan. 4-26; and "looked into the nooks and caranics. We're compiling lists. We'll begin now to consolidate the lists and set priorities."

In a written report, Hickey said current issues include:

O'Crhard Ridge, Farmington Hills — Drives, parking lots, site lighting, teen is courts, concrete bridge repair, pool building leaks, maintenance garage roof, concrete walk repair. (Henovations of the closed pool were started earlier.)

Southeast — at Royal Oaksprinkler system, repair of startway at parking structure, electrical power requirements. At Southfield: roofs, re-design of shipping dock, electrical power equirements.

Highland Lakes, Union Lake

shipping dock, electrical power re-quirements.

B Highland Lakes, Union Lake
— sidewalk repair, brick pavers at
entrance; re-roofing of Highland
Hall; tennis courts; site lighting.

Auburn Hills — parking lots,
taffice control and site lighting:

sues; drainage for the athlette

"We have also solicited lists from each campus of items that
