forms, the former holding a sharp piece above, the latter with a wide band gracefully folded across itself like a protective arm. "Geth-semane" with its jagged pieces conveys pain but also wonder. "Romeo and Juliet!" presents the struggle of Idealism and realism. Pieces from Wesner's "Pherein" (pronounced "fear-in") series are shown. The series title comes from the Greek for "tu car-p" and "to bear." They convey a balance with tension, a horizontal on a vertical. The vertical segments rise smoothly from the base and are allghtly curved to

receive the horizontal piece, which could be a yoke or a profile. Weaner named his "Eco" works for the "eche" of sound and response. Some feature round shapes that resemble Chinese hats (which contain the brain), howle (which contain and release communication). With others, the cound shapes are open, resembling emanations, or feature as excreen, something to catch or filter.
"I am the most excited about the newest work on a regular ba-

ais."

Wesner's attraction to art came early. A Philadelphia native, he enjoyed visiting Philadelphia Museum of Art as a youngster and seeing the Rodin, Brancus and Duchamp works.
"It was just real natural for me," asid Wesner, who built his own studio behind his house in Birmingham. "My parents did whatever they could to encourage me.
"I always was . . . fascinated with things that were made by artists or artisans."
