Awards will be presented on April 28, 1996 beginning at 2 p.m. at the Farmington Hill Activities Center, 28600 Eleven Mile Road, located east of Middlebelt Road, enter gate number 4.

Winners and their families, teachers and principal are invited to the award ceremony.

Winning art will be displayed at the Farmington Community Library, downtown branch, during the month of April and at the Festival of the Arts taking place at the Activities Center April 29 through May 5.

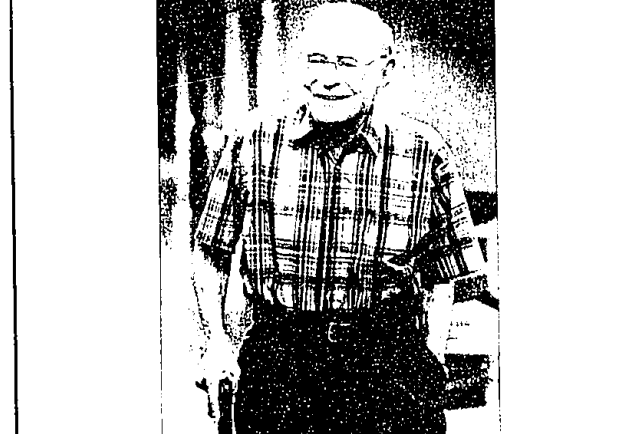
