

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**■ FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS**  
Farmington Hills firefighters made 99 runs from Feb. 25 to March 3 including 57 (58 percent) medical emergency runs, 11 rescues and five fires.

**■ FIRES**  
Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 put out a car fire that totaled \$3,000 a 1987 Dodge Shadow west of Orchard Lake on I-696 at 9:04 p.m. March 2. The fire began in the engine compartment and extended through to the passenger compartment. The driver said the car lost power and

began to smoke. He ran from it before the flames erupted. Damage to the contents was \$160.

**■ BREAK-INS**  
The passenger window was broken causing \$200 in damage to a blue 1991 Ford Explorer parked at The Target store on Grand River in Farmington Hills between Feb. 29 and March 1 and two speakers worth \$150 were stolen.

The driver's door window was broken and the door scratched (\$450) on a gold 1993 Saturn parked on Pink in Farmington Hills Feb. 28-29 during a break-in attempt.

The passenger window was broken (\$150) on a blue 1987 Pontiac Grand Am parked on Greenacres in Farmington Hills and a \$110

cellular phone was stolen between Feb. 20 and March 2.

The driver's door window was smashed (\$250) on a white 1995 GMC pickup parked on Greenacres in Farmington Hills and a \$600 cellular phone was stolen March 1-2.

Jewelry, watches, computer equipment, a camera and binoculars (\$3,275) were stolen after the front door had been kicked in (\$100) at a residence on Springbrook in Farmington Hills March 4.

A well clock (\$150) was stolen after the front was kicked in at Sam's Insurance on Grand River in Farmington between 6 p.m. and 10 a.m. March 3, causing \$200 damage.

In Federal Elections the law permits a disabled voter to designate any person of their choice to assist them. The person so designated may not be the voter's employer or an agent of their employer, nor an officer or agent of a labor union to which the voter belongs.
