

Tinnion signs 8 recruits for EMU squad

Eastern Michigan University coach Brian Tinnion is hoping the success of the Eagles' basketball team will rub off on the men's soccer program.

Tinnion, the former Detroit Express player and Detroit Rockers coach, has stockpiled his EMU recruiting class with Observerland talent.

"We were 8-12 (overall record) and at the bottom of the MAC, but we did get better as the season went along," said Tinnion of EMU's inaugural season. "With

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these players were bringing in, we not only have numbers, but the biggest thing is we're going to have competition for spots."

Tinnion has signed three first-team All-Observer prep players: "Goalkeeper George Tomasso, who helped lead Plymouth-Canton to the 1994 state Class A title. He had 11 shutouts and an 0.60 goals-against average; "Forward Drew Drummond, who led Plymouth Salem to the 1995 state championship, while

leading the Rocks in scoring with 22 goals and 10 assists; "Midfielder Brian Zawislak, a first-team All-Stater who led the Chargers with 10 goals and nine assists.

"I thought Tomasso was the best senior keeper in the state this year," Tinnion said. "He'll compete for the starting spot with Zachary Makris (Troy Athens), who will be a senior.

"Drummond will be an offensive midfielder, a guy who can play beyond the front two target men and drift occasionally out to the wing. He's a good passer with good vision.

"And Zawislak is a bread-and-butter kind of player, who has a great work ethic. He'll always give 100 percent."

Two Schoolcraft College play-

ers are in the fold — striker Mo Hujak, an NJCAA All-Region 12 pick who set a school record with 31 goals; and defender Dave Binkiewicz, who played as a prep at Livonia Franklin.

Tinnion also has a verbal commitment from another former Franklin Patriot, 1993 first-team All-Observer forward Victor Rodopoulos, who is expected to arrive in Ypsilanti after completing junior college credit requirements. Rodopoulos started his collegiate career at Central Michigan University, but transferred to Schoolcraft after the CMU program was dropped.

"Once you get Mo the ball and he faces the goal, he's tough to stop," the EMU coach said.

Aquatic swimmers finish 5th

The Spartan Aquatic Club, scoring 1,090 points, finished fifth in the 13 and over state championships held March 15-17 at Saginaw Valley State University.

New Spartan member Matt Kowalski, who did not figure in the team scoring because of the 120-day U.S. Swim waiting period, none-the-less tied for high-point honors in the Boys 16-17 age category. He placed third in the 1,000-yard freestyle; fourth, 400 individual medley; sixth, 200 backstroke; 200 IM, 200, 500 and 1,650 freestyle; 10th, 1,000 freestyle; 11th, 100 backstroke.

Julie Korn, competing in the Girls 13-14 division, took runner-up high-point honors. She won the 1,000 and 1,650 freestyle; second, 500 freestyle and 200 butterfly; third, 400 IM and 100 butterfly; fourth, 100 freestyle; 18th, 200 breaststroke.



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
