# Physics all star adds to academic list

Physics isn't the only thing that matters to Brendan Fay, but that's where he's making a name for himself lately.
His grasp of the science delving into physical properties is relative to his receiving several honors.
The Harrison High senior is one of 100 students nationally named as an All American in Physics. The student pool is selected by the American Association of Physics Teachers.

"Ey is also a semifinalist in the search for five high school seniors to represent the United States in the Physics Olympial in Olso, Norway this summer.
For that, Fay had to take a two-part test March 27. The first part involved four questions, which have to be answered in 90 minutes. The second part consisted of two more detailed questions, which also have a 90-minute time

limit.

Physics is only part of the equation in Fay's academic life, though.

Fay eventually plans to major in architecture.

His academic plate is as varied. He's taking level four Calculus at Oakland Community College and secored in the top 100 in the Michigan Mathematics prize.
