Artist conveys feeling of the West

The name "Grey" in connection with Westerns probably brings to mind writer Zane Grey. There's another "Grey" connected with Westerns — artist Joseph Grey II of Beverly Hills. His watercolor paintings of the West are displayed through April 13 at Cowboy Trader Gallery, in the Merrilwood Building on Merril west of Woodward in Birmingham (phone (810) 647-8833).

Grey's paintings in the exhibit shine like stained glass. Figures, objects and landscapes are made up of brightly colored segments. You see a variety of vibrant hues in almost every part of a scene — a pair of cowboy boots, a peace pipe. The ground is filled with radiant colors. A set of concentric circles depicts the sun, representing the circle of life. Most of the paintings feature horses, with shades including blue, green and pink.

Such elements don't trivialize the subject, but instead add a special magic. The scenes are realistic and at the same time almost abstract, with a touch of

cubism. They are spellbinding; parts seem about to move like an adjusting kaleidoscope. You can see a rugged landscape in the folds and shadings of a hat.

Grey's fascination with the West came from his grandmother, who was Choctaw and Cherokee. The artist's Indian figures show authentic symbols of their tribes. His love for horses came about while helping his father, a veterinarian who raised thoroughbreds.

Grey, who has been painting for 40 years in watercolor, oil and acrylic, was trained as a classical musician. He changed fields after a year at Ohio State University, and earned a master's degree from the Columbus College of Art and Design. He was an art director at Campbell Ewald and is now retired.

The artist's works are in collections around the country. He designed the Detroit Grand Prix poster in 1983.

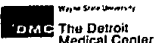
