Southfield hosts folk fest

The ninth annual International Folk Dance Festival, co-sponsored by the City of Southfield and the International Institute of Metropolitan Detroit, returns to the Southfield Civic Center 3:30-7 p.m. Sunday, April 14. Tickets are \$13.50 in advance.

The event features nine international dance groups in continuous performances and an ethnic buffet sponsored by area restaurants. Headlining this year's event is

"Echoes of Ukraine," a group of Canadian and American young people who combine their talents as dancers, musicians and vocalists. They are known for their skillful interpretations of Ukrainian folk dancing and have an unusually large repertoire of regional dances.

"Echoes" choreographies include regional folk dances, ancient ritual dances, royal court dances, modern dances and historical pageantry, complete with a stunning collection of historic costumes. The group is accompanied by a unique selection of traditional and authentic Ukrainian instruments, including the bandura, sopilka, drimba and tsymbaly.

They have performed on TV, at ethnic festivals, with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and Shakespeare Repertory Theatre. Many

of them are second- and third-generation American or Canadian citizens whose families have instilled their love of Ukrainian heritage.

Also starring in this year's program is the popular Maria Del Carmen's Groupa Espana, noted for their precision Spanish and Flamenco dance steps and ornate, authentic costumes. Joining them will be the Wawel Polish Folk Ensemble, Troupe TaAmulat Middle Eastern Dancers, Sarisan Slovak Folk Ensemble, Hora Aviv Israeli Folk Dance Troupe, Tugumpay, Philippine Cultural Ensemble, Art of Motion African Dancers, Tim O'Hare's School of Irish Step Dancing and the Vidyajali East Indian Dancers.

A buffet of international foods by area restaurants, gourmet coffees, and fine wines will be served 3:30-6 p.m.

Series features 'Emperor Jones'
