Hawks, Raiders begin with boys WLAA wins

Farmington Harrison and North Farmington began a new season in boys track Tuesday with dual-meet victories.

Harrison, runner-up in the Western Lakes Activities Association last year, whipped visiting Livonia Stevenson 79-68, and host North beat Walled Lake Western 75-62.

Senior Jason Granger won the long jump (11.2) and 200 dashes (23.42) for the Hawks.

Harrison won both hurdle events, with Steve Catherman clocking out at 16.2 in the 110 highs and Matt Hunt at 44.5 in the 300 intermediates.

The Hawks also had first places in the field events from Doug Brodski in the high jump (6-2) and Randy Forth in the pole vault (9-0).

Harrison won two relays. Jordan Johnson, Keith Battle, Chris Knox and Jason Sharp ran the 400 relay in 46.7, and

Kareem Smartt, Haas, Jared Roth and Brent Mackey combined for a 3:47 time in the 1,600 relay.

Stevenson had double winners in Stevenson's season in the shot put (44-7) and discus (123-6) and Steve Warner in the 1,600 (4:42) and 3,200 runs (10:22).

Ryan Kosutic and Phil Zaid had two individual victories apiece, one in a field event and another in a sprint, for the Raiders.

Zaid won the high jump (5-8) and the 400 run (54.7). Kosutic was first in the pole vault (11-0) and the 200 dash (24.8).

Kosutic also teamed with Matt Shaw, Russell Snow and Mike Liefer to win the 800 relay (1:37.7).

The Raiders took first place in the 3,200 relay (8:55.3) with the

team of Brian Kristall, Dan Gabriel, Sam Long and Brian Rajdl.

North had one other victory, from Rob DeRoven in the shot put (40-6).

NVILLE 92, FARMING. 45: Mike Foreman won the shot put (47-5.25) and the discus (131-9.5) Tuesday for the Falcons.

Farmington also had firsts from Matt Niskanen in the high hurdles (17.1) and Keith Sudheimer in the high jump (6-4).

Sudheimer and Niskanen were second in the long jump (16-11) and the intermediate hurdles (45.1), respectively.

The Falcons got seconds in the discus from Brian Washnock (118-8.5) and Ethan Smith in the 800 run (2:15).

"Keith and Matt had good days for the cold and windy conditions," coach Chip Bridges said. "Mike Foreman had a big (personal record) in the discus. That was really a nice throw."

Leo led the area last year in the 1,600 (4:24) and 3,200 (8:24.5) runs. He was fifth in the regional and state in the latter.

"Joe hasn't run in two weeks," CC coach Tony Magni said. "His knee has been bothering him; he's never had an injury. As for John, he should be improved."

Another standout thrower is senior Jeff Monette (46-11.75) in the shot.

Other key returnees for the Shamrocks include senior long jumper and sprinter Kevin Quay, junior Brian Teeley (62.9 in the 400), junior Chris Laney (2:03.1 in the 800) and junior John Griffin (9:49.5 in the 3,200).

Magni is also counting on senior David Vonnung (hurdles), senior Roy Sample (sprints), senior Rich Stachura (middle distance), junior Brian Douglas (shot put), junior Dan Dominguez (shot put), junior Greg Alcala (sprints), sophomore Dave Popiel (high jump) and senior Erin Kosmowski (discus).

"We're strong again in the shot put and discus," said Magni, whose team won the Catholic League and Operation Friendship crowns a year ago.

"We lost three of our top four in the 1,600 and 3,200 relays. We don't have depth like we used to, even though we have the numbers (about 100) as far as needing kids to step up and fill the gaps. I suspect we'll have some."
