

•Rule leaves away from the side of the house and clean out basement window wells, clear away debris on or around your air conditioner.

 Trim shrubs and trees so they don't touch the house. This also helps eliminate hiding places for any wouldbe burglars.

Patch or replace any window and door screens that have holes.

· Too many people forget about cleaning or replacing furnace filters during air conditioning season. Whether you have central air or a room air conditioner, keep those filters clean.
