## Concerts are noteworthy

Detroit Symphony Orchestra continues its new Tiny Tots music series for youngsters ages 3-6 with "Tubby the Tuba and his Instrument Friends" 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. at Mercy High School Auditorium (11 Mile Road at Middlebelt) in Farmington Hills. Tickets are \$9, call (313) 833-3700 or (810) 645-6666.

This concert will feature DSO Associate Conductor Ian Shui leading the orchestra, narrator Rhoda Becker, and Wesley Jacobs, DSO's principal tuba. Special Guest Clown Tom Dougherty will also be on-site for

some musical horseplay. The program will take children on a "fun run" through the members of the instrument family. Members of the DSO will move to center stage to demonstrate just what and how they play. Musical selections vary from Anderson's "Plink, Plank, Plunk," to Tchaikovsky's "Dance of the Merlitts" from "The Nutcracker," to Kleinsinger's "Tubby the Tuba."

Also of note: The Pontiac-Oakland Symphony will play Mozart, Beethoven, and Liszt at its concert 7 p.m. Sunday, April 14 at Pontiac Central High

Elizabeth Rowin will be the featured guest soloist, playing the Mozart violin concerto No. 5. A native of Bloomfield Hills, Rowin serves on the music faculty of Oakland University. She is also concertmaster of the Warren and Southfield Symphonies. She is a member of the Michigan Opera Theatre orchestra, and has performed locally with the Lyric Chamber Ensemble, the Michigan Bach Festival, and the Michigan Composers Series.

Gillette's musical style reflects his roots in country and western music. His songs have been recorded by Garth Brooks, John Denver, Waylon Jennings, Kenny Rogers, Linda Ronstadt and Tammy Wynette. His wife, Cindy, has long been a favorite of fans who favor traditional material,

although her repertoire includes songs of contemporary songwriters and original songs as well. She plays the guitar, concertina and banjo, but is best known for her voice.

House built his first dulcimer while in college, and his latest instrument, a six-string model, was constructed in 1994. His repertoire includes tunes from around the world with an emphasis on the Celtic tradition.
