

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

■ BREAK-INS

Several cars parked at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill in Farmington Hills were broken into April 8-9.
