

Salmon Stakes has charitable purpose

Looking for something to do this weekend? Well, look no further.

Let's see... spring turkey season is open if you were lucky enough to draw a permit... the general trout and salmon season opens Saturday on designated trout waters... and walleye, sauger, pike and muskie seasons also open Saturday on inland waters to the lower peninsula.

If you're not interested in any participatory sports quite yet you can take a leisurely drive east to St. Clair and watch the weigh-in of the 18th Annual River Crab Salmon Stakes fishing tournament on Saturday afternoon. You could even win a trip to Disney World.

Based at Chuck Mueer's River Crab Restaurant just north of St. Clair, the Salmon Stakes tournament is held annually to raise funds to benefit the children, adults and their families throughout Michigan.

The tournament has raised over \$700,000 over the years and netted better than \$100,000 last year alone.

Money is raised through the sale of \$10 raffle/entry tickets. Ticket holders are automatically entered in the grand raffle. The tickets are also good for entry in the tournament. The grand prize in the raffle is a trip for four to Walt Disney World. A fantastic fishery

Southern Lake Huron, with its shallow waters along the shoreline, offers some of the earliest spring salmon fishing of the season. As the water nears the 40-degree mark, smelt and perch move toward shore and the rivers, creeks and cuts used for spawning.

Salmon, steelhead, brown trout and walleye follow to take advantage of the huge schools of bait fish.

The late arrival of spring is wakening havoc for anglers so far this year. The St. Clair River is still full of ice flows and no boats can get out into the river.

The Black River at Port Huron is also plugged up with ice, but anglers are able to get into Lake Huron through the ports at Lake Port, Lexington, Port Sanilac and Harbor Beach.

Upwards of 250 boats and 1,000 anglers annually participate in the Salmon Stakes tournament. The weigh-in begins at 1 p.m. Saturday at the River Crab Restaurant and will feature a barbecue, live entertainment and a trout pond for the kids. The River Crab is located three miles north of St. Clair on River Road.
