

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS**

Farmington Hills firefighters made 91 runs for the week of April 15-21 including 47 medical emergencies (52 percent), 10 rescues, five fires and four downed power lines.

**FIRES**

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 put out a fire that started in the dashboard of a 1979

Chevy Camaro on Middlebelt at 2:14 p.m. April 18. There was \$700 in damage to the car and \$400 to its contents.

Farmington Hills firefighters responded to a fire in a 1980 Chevy box van on the ramp of southbound I-275 from eastbound I-696 at 2:35 p.m. April 19. The fire was coming from the engine compartment and dash. A witness had put out the fire with a chemical extinguisher. The driver said antifreeze had been leaking from the van when she pulled off the road. Damage to the van was \$1,000. Farmington Hills firefighters

from Stations 2 and 4 put out a garage and gas meter fire at a residence on Shrewsbury at 12:05 a.m. April 20. Firefighters could not shut off the gas and had to put out the fire fires. Damage to the property was \$15,000.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Stations 2 and 3 responded to a fire on the porch at a Seventh Day Adventist Church on 10 Mile at 9:13 a.m. April 20. A bird's nest near a light fixture had caught fire. The fire, which caused \$100 in damage, was out when firefighters arrived.

**VANDALISM**

The outside pool and clubhouse lights were broken at the Windemere Apartments on Independence April 18-19 causing \$300 in damage.

The driver's side tires were punctured (\$650) on a yellow 1996 Chevy Corvette parked at the Cordoba Apartments on Cordoba April 18-19.

Three holes caused by BBs were made in the front window (\$300) of a residence on Dresden April 12-20.

The left side of a white 1967 Ford Galaxy parked at Founders Sports Park on Eight Mile was

keyed (\$500) April 17.

A rock was thrown at a green 1996 Mercury Sable near the Detroit Newspaper Agency on Crestview April 23, breaking a window (\$250). The car's owner said the rock was thrown from a group of about 17 people on strike at the location.

**BREAK-INS**

The front door was entered at a house on Haynes April 18, and a \$1,200 Romington 12-gauge shotgun, \$600 men's gold bracelet, \$400 man's gold necklace and \$100 AM/FM CD stereo were stolen.

The roll-up gate at the concession stand at the Founders Sports Park on Eight Mile was pried open (\$700) and the cash register was damaged (\$200) and candy bars, potato chips and pretzels (\$100) were stolen April 19-20.

A large whole was made in a Coke machine (\$1,500) at the Country Ridge apartments on Crest Forest April 20-21 and an unknown amount of coins were stolen.

The driver's window was broken (\$300) on a gray 1992 Plymouth Sundance at Bob Saks on Grand River April 20-22 and a
