An 8-minute video documenting the making of the "Faces" sculpture that stands outside the east entrance to the Farmington City Hall will be shown during the Monday, May 6, Farmington City Council meeting.

The meeting begins at 8 p.m. at the City Hall, Grand River and Liberty Street. Sculptor Kephah Tazian, a Farmington Hills resident and a professor at Oakland Community College, produced the work
