Faminipton-area residents can
properly dispose of dangerous
household products at the annual
Household Hazardous Waste Day
9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, May 11,
at the 47th District Court on 10
Mile Road, in Farmington.
Participants are asked to enter
the District Court, 3279S W. Mile Road, from northbown I
Mile Road, from northbown I
Shiswassee and 10 Mile.
Technicians from Waste Man-

agement and Chemical Waste Management will unload hazardous materials from the cars. Household products such as cleaners, solvents, turpentine, aerosol cans, pesticides, hetbicides, gasoline mixtures, glues and antiferene will be accepted. Farmington Hills offers tips for packing and transporting household hazardous material:

Make sure cach container is properly labeled.

Wer solld materials, place each container in its own plastic bag

and close it tightly.

For liquid materials, make sure
the cap is secure. If the cap is
missing, transfer the contents to a
secure container and label proper-

M If a container is leaking, put the contents in a non-leaking con-tainer and label.

Place containers in a box with a

sturdy bottom.

If containers are made of glass,

put paper between them.

No latex or water-based paint
will be accepted. Also not accept-

od: compressed gas cylindors, radioactive material (including
some smoke detectors), explosives, shock-sensitive compounds
and medical waste.
It an item is unacceptable, it
will be repackaged, labeled and
raturned. The owner can contact
the Department of Environmental
Quality for disposal information.
Farmington Hills offers the following advice on how to dispose of
paint:

paint:
The best way to dispose of latez
paint is to use it. If the paint

can't be used, it can be disposed of with the regular refuse provided a few simple procedures are followed.

With only an inch or two of paint left in the can, allow the paint to dry. Find a safe area away from children, pets and rain, and with an adequate air flow. Remove the lid and allow the paint to dry. The process can be speeded up by mitting an equal amount of absorbent material such as cat litter, sand or plaster of paris.


Allow the mixture to dry. Then place the cans in the rubbish with the lids off so the hauler can see the hardened paint.

Paint should never be dumped to the part of the paint should never be dumped.

Paint should never be dumped on the ground or down storm or sewer drains. Small amounts of paint can be asfely washed down the sink, but this should be limited to brush cleaning and general clean up. Household Hazardous Waste Day is a cooperative effort between the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills.
