Thousands from area suburbs walk in birth defect battle

They lit the road for loved ones y the thousands in Oskiand County, where more than 4,000 took part Sunday in the March of Dimes WalkAmerica, a 20-kilometer trek to raise money for babysaving research of Dimes estimated Monday that 4850,000 was raised out of Oskiand County alone, where people walked out of Auburn Hills, Farmington Hills and Troy — three of 14 southeast Michigan WalkAmerica sites. The fundraising tally for those locations is as follows:

8 Auburn Hills: Over 1,000 people walked of rom the Oskiand Community College Auburn Hills campus, raising over \$100,000.

Teams walking in Auburn Hills included OCC, EDS, Oskland County, Comerica, Chrysler and Siemens.

8 Farmington Hills: Over 1,000

included OCC, EDS, Oakland County, Comerica, Chrysler and Slemena.

Farmington Hills: Over 1,000 people walked from the Oakland Community College Orchard Ridge campus, reising nearly \$160,000.

Teams walking in Farmington Hills included Kroger, Home Depot, Frontler, Sprint and Weight Watchers.

Farmy: Led by Kmart spokesperson and model Kathy Ireland and Kmart Chairman Floyd Hall, more than 2,000 walkers participated, beginning at the Community Center. They reised more than \$200,000.

Teams walking in Troy, besides Troy-based Kmart, included EDS, Kelly Services, Standard Federal and Chrysler.

"The people of southeast Michigan came out in mass to walk for someone they love," said Sam McGoun, March of Dimes chepter

chairman. "They demonstrated their commitment to helping ever ye child have a healthy start in life. We are thrilled with the success of this year's WalkAmerica." McGoun said funds raised over the weekend will help continue the "fight against birth defects and infant mertality," through programs of research, education, community service and advocacy.
