Armed with these two videos, Dr. Singer's work was cut out for him. He contacted the University of Michigan's Department of

Physical Therapy in Flint. Research scientists there were sufficiently impressed with what they saw to apply for a grant from the University of Michigan used to primarily pay for the expenses of the subjects of the study. The study began in June of 1995 and was completed in Decomber of 1996. The first results of the study were presented at the Oakland University School of Health Sciences March 8.

Dr. Singer and Todd have documented the study since its inception and have about 30 hours dideo they plan to edit and show in the near future on INFO TV-12. Check your TV guide for listings and times.
