"There's a possibility that a crime has been committed by taking the body out of state without notifying the medical examiner." Dwyer sald, "We'll submit our findings to the prosecutor... we'll do what we have to do."

Conspiracy charges against the attending physicians were a possibility, Dwyer sald, "There have been some violations," he said. Goods were cooperating in the investigation, said Dwyer, who added that he and Ray

Good were on the Detroit police force together many years ago.

"They're good people," Dwyer sald. "I know the Goods person-sily. That's why I came out here. She said her hueband did not assist in the suicide. They just allowed their house to be used."

Dwyer wouldn't say what Janet Good told him about Bastable's death, and the Goods declined to speak to re-porters Wednesday. Janet Good learned last year

that she was suffering from pancreatic cancer and that her prognosis was not good. "I have less than a year," she told re-porters last November.

She also said she would not seek help from Jack Kevorkian
— who has assisted at least 28 people end their lives since 1990 — because he's too good a fixed.

Kevorkian was acquitted in two previous trials concerning assisted suicide.


