marker (near the edge of the road), which was where she should have been," Green said. The woman died of multiple injuries after her head struck the car's windshield and she was thrown onto the side of the road. An accident reconstruction expert found that the car had been exceeding the 40 mph speed limit. Police said the car's driver admitted to drinking before the incident. He could be charged with operating under the influence of alcohol resulting in death, a 15-year felony; negligent homicide, a 2-year misdemeanor or possibly manslaughter, also a 15-year felony. He was being held in the Farmington Hills City Jail Wednesday awaiting arraignment. The man has a valid California driver's license with no significant traffic or criminal record, Green said.

A 18-year-old Hills boy was killed while riding his bike home by a drunk driver in Farmington Hills in September of 1995. It was one of two fatal accidents involving drunken driving in 1995.

Ms. Rainbow is survived by her parents, Pastor Thomas and Betty Weber, brothers Art and his wife Alyson, John and his wife Monica; a sister Karen Vogel and her husband Larry; her grandmother Helene Schultz; and her dear companion and friend Tony Vasquez.

She will rest in state Thursday from 3-5 p.m. and 6-9 p.m. at the Harry J. Will Trust 100 Funeral Home, 37000 Six Mile east of I-275 in Livonia. Memorial services are Friday at 11 a.m. at St. John Lutheran Church, 23225 Gill Road in Farmington Hills.

"There's a possibility that a crime has been committed by taking the body out of state without notifying the medical examiner," Dwyer said. "We'll submit our findings to the prosecutor . . . we'll do what we have to do."

Conspiracy charges against the attending physicians were a possibility, Dwyer said. "There have been some violations," he said.

The Goods were cooperating in the investigation, said Dwyer, who added that he and Ray

Good were on the Detroit police force together many years ago.

"They're good people," Dwyer said. "I know the Goods personally. That's why I came out here. She said her husband did not assist in the suicide. They just allowed their house to be used."

Dwyer wouldn't say what Janet Good told him about Bastable's death, and the Goods declined to speak to reporters Wednesday. Janet Good learned last year

that she was suffering from pancreatic cancer and that her prognosis was not good. "I have less than a year," she told reporters last November.

She also said she would not seek help from Jack Kevorkian—who has assisted at least 28 people and lived here since 1990—because he's too good a friend.

Kevorkian was acquitted in two previous trials concerning assisted suicide.
