Farmington budget proposes \$7 tax hike, no extra services

For \$6.96 more in taxes, the owner of an average priced home in Farmington can expect the same city services.

The proposed \$8.54 million 1996-97 budget calls for a .12-mill increase in the general fund operations taxes.

A public bearing will take place Monday, June 3, in city council chambers. Council would then consider approving the recommended budget.

The less-than-one percent tail to 15.66 mills, including debt service. That adds up to \$908.28 a year for an owner of the average priced home, which is \$116,000 according to Chamber of Commerce statistics.

City Manager Frank Lauhoff formally presented the balanced budget to city council at Monday's meeting.


