Program helps workers cope with layoffs, downsizing

Curront trends in corporate downsizing, "right-sizing" and restructuring, and the resulting uncertainty and loss of job security, may be increasing the stress that leads to workplace violence, says Stofanie Zin, director of employee assistance programs at Oakland Family Services.

"After a downsizing effort,

omployees may initially feel shock and disbelief," Zin said.
Following these initial feelings, Zin said employees may feel anger, sadness and resentment. Later, omployees may experience depression and anxiexy, feelings of betrayel and discontent, and finally, a loss of self-esteem. "All these feelings may contribute to a disgruntled employee acting out in violent
