## Screen out pesky visitors

A damaged window or door screen could cause countless hours of scratching and swatting pesky insects that may come in through the

Replacing the screening on a door or window is a quick and easy do-it--

yourself project. The whole replacement should cost no more than \$10 and should be finished in about an hour.

Fiberglass screening is especially suited for coastal areas since it will not corrode, rust or dent. It is vinyl coated for strength and durability

Aluminum screening is also rustproof. Although it is more expensive that fiberglass, it is stronger and less likely to sag or toar. It comes in three colors: bright or natural finish, charcoal

or black.

Both types of screening are replaced the same way. Before you replace the screen, you need to remove the dam-

aged portion from the aluminum frame.

Pry the vinyl spline from the grooves around the adge of the frame with a screwdriver. Ratain the old spline, if it is still flexible or replace it with a new spline, which sells for approximately \$1.50.



retaining grooves. Use a spline roller to press the spline and screen into the grooves. Cut away the excess screen fabric with

a utility knife.
"If you have a large piece of screen left over, save it for future replace-ments. Pre-ralled screen-

ments. Fraction actions ing is large enough to replace an average door," says Sanford Maltman, Home Depot building materials associate.
Use the concave roller of the splining tool to force the spline and screening into the groove. Use short, firm strokes. Cut off the excess spline and screen

To replace the screening in the wooden frame, remove the strips covering the screen edge and take off the screen. the screen edge and take off the screen.
Unroll the new screening vertically and
staple in place. To finish, nail or track
the wooden strips back to the screen
frame, covering the edges.

If the wooden strips are corroded, you
should replace them as well. "If no


