Road and a section of Farming-tion township that has been pressing for road improve-ments for two years, was clos-ed last week to through traffic. Closure was made by a six-foot high and 38-footlong wood-

foot high and 38-footlong wood-en fence stretching across the street.

Portions of the fence had been dismantled sometime over the weekend.

There is some question whether the fence is on county

property.
"I expect that if the fence is on county property, it will be removed," said Farmington Township Supervisor Curtis H.

Hall said that he had contact-ed the Calland County Road Commission but that he had re-ceived no word on the matter. Township Attorney Joseph T. Brennan said that the city could legally erect a fence because they had jurisdiction over their own streets.

Brennan said that under the township form of government a township could not ask the county road commission to rule on a matter concerning a city
