The lady is Mrs. Hiram Henderson, of the 11th District women's auxiliary Veterans of Foreign Wars. She was especially glad to come from Bay City to present a flag to Brownie Troop 243 because one of its members is her great-granddaughter, seven-year-old Carolle Moore.

And the occasion brought back memories. Because among the many flags that Mrs. Henderson has presented in the past was one to the troop of Brownies

(youngest girls in the Girl Scout organization) that included Carolle's mother, Mrs. Fred Moore, THAT WAS in November of 1949, when Mrs. Moore was JoAnne Prell and a brand new Brownie.

At that time, Mrs. Henderson was a member of the Women's Relief Corps in Bay City, affiliated with that group, and later with the YFW, Mrs. Henderson has had a hand in giving lots of flags—probably 50 or 60—to Boy Scout, Girl Scout and school groups.

But she has a special spot in her heart for Brownie troops, perhaps because at one time she was an assistant

Brownie leader.

She and her granddaughter recalled that she also presented a banner to the Brownie troop that included Mrs. Moore's sister on its roster.

The stars and stripes given Plymouth Allen School Troop 243 and its leader Mrs. Joyce Dasher, was one of the best available, the flag lady said. It cost about \$22.

Carolle has a little sister, three-year-old Simone, who will be ready for Brownies in about four years.

The Michigan Parent-Teacher organization hopes small "Suzie" will help reduce smoking among young people.

Booklets with a cute little girl in grown-up clothing on the cover are being distributed to some 2,000 local PTA chapters in the state.

"Suzie" is meant to show how closely children imitate their elders and serve as a gentle reminder to parents to examine their own smoking habits.

THEY ARE also urging parents to initiate local projects, and to support existing health education programs dealing with smoking.

Sponsored by the Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers, the project is also supported by the American Cancer Society, Michigan Heart Association, Michigan Department of Public Health, Michigan Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association, Michigan State Medical Society, the Michigan Health Council, and ten additional groups.


### Has Ingathering
