Clarenceville selects school chief from Plymouth-Canton district

Dr. Tom Tattan, Plymouth-Canton Community Schools' executive director for instruction, will take the helm as superintendent of the Clarenceville School District in Livonia July 1.

His hiring is expected to become official when the school board votes this evening (Thursday).

Formerly principal of Plymouth Canton High, Tattan was selected from a field of 3' applicants. He replaces David Kamish, who retires June 30 after five years as superintendent, and 34 years in Clarenceville.

Clarenceville has a student body of 1,750, with one high school, one middle school, two elementaries and a \$12.6 million hugget. Per pupil spending is \$6,700 — \$1,000 more than Plymouth-Cantons.






