WARM WEATHER & ARTHRITIS?

In a previous column I described the problems someone with arthritis faces in the winter. Not cold, but the strain of wearing clothes and boots, and the hazard of walking on snow and ice, strained parts and created additional fatigue.

Now that warm weather is here, does life with arthritis become easier? The answer is yes and no.

If you have psoriatic arthritis, the return of sun and light breeds both the skin and the joints. If you have Lupus arthritis, then the same conditions are sources of misery, as the UV waves activate Lupus.

Otherwise, for arthritic patients going outdoors becomes pleasurable. You are encouraged to exercise, as there is no risk from walking, and you need no gloves or heavy coat.

What becomes difficult to deal with is the indoors. Air conditioning whether central, or room air, brings uneven cooling to your body. The result chills the muscles and creates a stiffness that resembles your morning ache.

If you are going to public place like a restaurant, market, or theater where you have no control over the temperature, then you may need to carry a tote bag with sweater even mittens. You may have no choice but to prepare for warm weather as if it were cold again.
